According to some statistics, about 30% of caregivers will die before their Loved One.

Caregiving can be very stressful. Ordinary estate planning often has one spouse

leaving the entirety of their assets to their surviving spouse. But if the caregiver spouse dies first there may be issues. This may happen when a person dies without having a valid will in place; then his or her property passes to heirs according to state law.

All U.S. states have laws or statutes of this kind. This may result in assets being left to the spouse who is in a long-term care community with Medicaid. These assets may unintentionally result in the loss of Medicaid as a payment source.

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HAVE YOU CREATED AN EMERGENCY MEDICAL PLAN? WHERE IS IT LOCATED?

Being organized and sharing necessary information will help caregivers. Don't just tell your family "Everything is taken care of," especially when it's not. Give them the details, such as the contact information of your doctors, allergies, medications, attorney, where you keep your important documents, and when you created them, (hopefully within the past five years), the list of people you want them to call for assistance, and who has agreed to step up if you need help.



DID YOU KNOW?

Prescription drug prices are **not** regulated. The cost of a prescription may differ by more than \$100 between pharmacies across the street from each other! Insurance isn't helping like it used to. In the past 10 years, insurance companies started passing 25-80% more of the cost of drugs onto patients. GoodRx gathers current prices and discounts to help you find the lowest cost pharmacy for your prescriptions. GoodRx is 100% free. No registration required.

Other drug manufacturers have coupons and discounts, but you will have to look up the pharmaceutical company and then the name of the drug to see what may be available. Often it is well worth the effort!
