SBIOMARKER RESEARCH

Researchers found that one biomarker is detectable in spinal fluid at least 10 years before signs of dementia appear. Scientists have found the earliest biological marker in the body linked to the risk of getting the killer brain condition. The breakthrough could lead to people who may not fully develop dementia until a decade later being given drugs immediately.
